With reference to your request for information I can confirm in accordance with Section 1 (1) of the Freedom of Information Act 2000 that we partially hold the information that you have requested. A response to each part of your request is below.

Please note, as of 1st April 2020 the following Clinical Commissioning Groups (CCGs), NHS Mansfield & Ashfield CCG, NHS Newark & Sherwood CCG, NHS Nottingham City CCG, NHS Nottingham North & East CCG, NHS Nottingham West CCG and NHS Rushcliffe CCG, merged to become NHS Nottingham and Nottinghamshire CCG. - 1. Accessing newly approved migraine treatment Fremanezumab
  - Fremanezumab is classified as RED on the medicines formulary and is prescribed within hospital only. You may wish to contact the individual providers to request this information. - 2. Has it been signed off and implemented
  - Fremanezumab is classified as RED on the medicines formulary and is prescribed within hospital only. You may wish to contact the individual providers to request this information. - 3. Was access to Fremanezumab signed within the 90 days of NICE approval
  - Fremanezumab was added to the formulary with 90 days of NICE technology appraisal (TA)
- 4. How many patients have blue tech approval in your clinical commissioning area
  - The CCG does not hold this information. Blueteq is used for prior approval for all of the procedures included in the CCGs Service Restricted Commissioning Policy. The treatment of migraine is not included in the policy, so prior approval would not be sought from our provider trusts for treatment. - 5. How many specialists are there in your area/do you have a headache specialist clinic

Generally, the ICO cannot make a decision unless you have exhausted the complaints procedure provided by NHS Nottingham and Nottinghamshire Clinical Commissioning Group formerly known as NHS Mansfield and Ashfield Clinical Commissioning Group, NHS Newark and Sherwood Clinical Commissioning Group, NHS Rushcliffe Clinical Commissioning Group, NHS Nottingham West Clinical Commissioning Group, NHS Nottingham City Clinical Commissioning Group and Nottingham North and East Clinical Commissioning Group.
