<b>Nottingham &amp; Nottinghamshire CCG response regarding future Commissioning Intentions</b>	<p>In 2020 across the East Midlands region, a procurement committee was convened to progress the regional IUC procurement. Nottingham and Nottinghamshire CCG had membership on this group and the lead CCG for this procurement was Derby and Derbyshire CCG (DDCCG).</p> <p>This group commenced a process to procure a regional 111 service, local clinical assessment services (CAS) and out of hours (OOHs) services. The process was in its infancy with an expression of interest sent out to all providers. In addition, Nottingham and Nottinghamshire CCG IUC programme board had started to develop plans for a local procurement process (aligned to the regional procurement timescales) to commission</p>
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	<p>the additional elements of the IUC pathway (urgent treatment centres and urgent primary care at the front door of ED).</p> <p>However, the COVID 19 pandemic has resulted in a 12 month pause on these procurement plans. Along with other commissioners in the East Midlands we will be learning from the developments to the urgent care pathway (for example NHS 111 First) that have taken place during the pandemic response to shape our future commissioning intentions.</p>
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If you are unhappy with the way in which your request has been handled, NHS Nottingham and Nottinghamshire Clinical Commissioning Group have an internal review procedure through which you can raise any concerns you might have. Generally, the ICO cannot make a decision unless you have exhausted the complaints procedure provided by NHS Nottingham and Nottinghamshire Clinical Commissioning Group formerly known as NHS Mansfield and Ashfield Clinical Commissioning Group, NHS Newark and Sherwood Clinical Commissioning Group, NHS Rushcliffe Clinical Commissioning Group, NHS Nottingham West Clinical Commissioning Group, NHS Nottingham City Clinical Commissioning Group and Nottingham North and East Clinical Commissioning Group.
