RE: Freedom of Information Request

With reference to your request for information I can confirm in accordance with Section 1 (1) of the Freedom of Information Act 2000 that we do not hold the information that you have requested.

In the request you asked:

I would like to please request the following information with regards to your Tier 2 weight management service, if applicable:

How many patients do you believe are eligible in your CCG?

How many patients do you currently have on your waiting list?

How many patients have you referred in the last 12 months?

Tier 2 weight management services are commissioned by the local authorities and therefore the CCG does not hold the requested information. You may wish to contact Nottingham City Council and Nottinghamshire County Council to request this information. If you are unhappy with the way in which your request has been handled, NHS Nottingham and Nottinghamshire Clinical Commissioning Group have an internal review procedure through which you can raise any concerns you might have. If you remain dissatisfied with the outcome of the internal review, you can apply to the Information Commissioner's Office, who will consider whether the organisation has complied with its obligations under the Act, and can require the organisation to remedy any problems. Generally, the ICO cannot make a decision unless you have exhausted the complaints procedure provided by NHS Nottingham and Nottinghamshire Clinical Commissioning Group.
