RE: Freedom of Information Request

With reference to your request for information I can confirm in accordance with Section 1 (1) of the Freedom of Information Act 2000 that we partially hold the information that you have requested. A response to each part of your request is below.

In the request you asked:

I am preparing research on the process of cardiological diagnostics with the use of ECG in the British healthcare system. As part of my work, I analyze private and public health services, research using ECG to diagnose arrhythmias. In researching the information available on the Internet, I was able to establish many important facts. For example, I have determined that there are currently 1,250 PCNs in England and over 90% of GPs are members of the PCNs. Currently there are 135 CCGs and they are in charge of buying services for their local community from any service provider that meets NHS standards and costs.

Unfortunately, I still do not understand how exactly PCN and its associated entities work. I would like to kindly ask you for help in answering the following questions or pointing to a website on the Internet that may help me answer the following questions:

- 1. What requirements do GPs / GP practices have to meet in order to be able to order 24 hour ECGs (Holter Monitor Tests)?

- 2. According to my estimates, one PCN carries out about 500 tests per year using 12-Lead ECG.
 - Do you have information on how many 12-Lead ECG are performed annually in the UK?

 - Do you have any information on how many 24 hour ECGs are performed annually in the UK?
 - NHS Nottingham and Nottinghamshire CCG do not hold this information.
 - How many 24 hour ECGs examinations are carried out in your system?

3. How often is AF (atrial fibrillation) diagnosed among the ECG performed? According to my data, 16.5% of patients diagnosed with the Holter test have AF.
