**RE: Freedom of Information Request** 

With reference to your request for information I can confirm in accordance with Section 1 (1) of the Freedom of Information Act 2000 that we partially hold the information that you have requested. A response to each part of your request is below.

In the request you asked:

1. Are there any internal documents or guidelines that restrict the prescribing of liquid antidepressants?

No, any recommendations for each product are listed within the formulary medication entry. This information is publicly available via <a href="https://www.nottinghamshireformulary.nhs.uk">https://www.nottinghamshireformulary.nhs.uk</a>

2. Do you have any guidance for prescribers regarding tapering of antidepressants? If so, could you provide a copy of the relevant documents.

3. Do you use any prescribing decision support software, or other tools such as PMR system searches, which identify prescribing of liquid antidepressants and recommend a switch to other formulations?

No.

4. Do you engage in any proactive correspondence with practices to encourage other formulations over liquid formulations?

Yes. We use Optimise Rx to encourage cost effective prescribing choices and have this guidance document <a href="https://www.nottsapc.nhs.uk/media/1300/current\_specials-a-z-notts.pdf">https://www.nottsapc.nhs.uk/media/1300/current\_specials-a-z-notts.pdf</a> which applies to all places except Bassetlaw Place-Based Partnership (PCP). Bassetlaw PCP also uses Optimise Rx to encourage cost effective prescribing choices, however this does not include the above document

5. I have also found no mention of Paroxetine, Fluvoxamine and Duloxetine on the formulary. Am I right to assume this will be a non-formulary item even though it is not listed on the non-formulary list?

If you are unhappy with the way in which your request has been handled, NHS Nottingham and Nottinghamshire Integrated Care Board (ICB) have an internal review procedure through which you can raise any concerns you might have. If you remain dissatisfied with the outcome of the internal review, you can apply to the Information Commissioner's Office (ICO), who will consider whether the organisation has complied with its obligations under the Act and can require the organisation to remedy any problems. Generally, the ICO cannot make a decision unless you have exhausted the complaints procedure provided by NHS Nottingham and Nottinghamshire ICB.
