RE: Freedom of Information Request

With reference to your request for information I can confirm in accordance with Section 1 (1) of the Freedom of Information Act 2000 that we do hold the information that you have requested. A response to each part of your request is below.

Please note that both NHS Nottingham and Nottinghamshire, and Bassetlaw Clinical Commissioning Groups ceased operation on 30 June 2022. They have been superseded by NHS Nottingham and Nottinghamshire Integrated Care Board (ICB) which began operation on 1 July 2022.

In the request you asked:

Do you have a Tier 3 Weight Management programme? If so, please provide the contract expiry date, contract value and vendor name.

Yes. There are programmes provided by Doncaster and Bassetlaw Hospitals NHS FT (DBHFT) and University Hospitals of Derby and Burton (UHDB). Both are rolling annual contracts with funding as part of a wider block arrangement. Re-procurement is not planned at this time.

Who is the senior officer/officer (outside of procurement) responsible for Tier 3 Weight Management? Hazel Buchanan, Associate Director of Strategic Programmes & EPRR

Do you have a Diabetes Structured Education programme? If so, please provide the contract expiry date, contract value and vendor name.

Bassetlaw - Bassetlaw has a structured programme delivered by three parties - DBHFT, Nottinghamshire Healthcare NHS Foundation Trust and Sheffield Teaching Hospitals NHS Foundation Trust. The programmes are:

- Type 1: Dose Adjustment for Normal Eating (DAFNE)
- Type 2: DESMOND and Super Six Team

Nottingham City – the programme DESMOND is provided by Nottingham CityCare Partnership for the locality of Nottingham City. This is included within the Nottingham CityCare Partnership's Out of Hospital Community Services Contract which expires 31 March 2025. Nottinghamshire Healthcare NHS Foundation Trust provide DESMOND for Nottinghamshire

Nottinghamshire County (excluding Bassetlaw) – DESMOND is provided by Nottinghamshire Healthcare NHS Foundation Trust.

For Type 1 structured education programmes in Nottingham City and Nottinghamshire (excluding Bassetlaw) DAFNE is provided by Nottingham University Hospitals NHS Trust and KAREN is provided by Sherwood Forest Hospitals NHS Foundation Trust.

The structured education programmes are embedded into routine contracting with the providers mentioned above and funding is part of wider block arrangements.

Who is the senior officer/officer (outside of procurement) responsible for Diabetes Structured Education? Hazel Buchanan, Associate Director of Strategic Programmes & EPRR

If you are unhappy with the way in which your request has been handled, NHS Nottingham and Nottinghamshire Integrated Care Board (ICB) have an internal review procedure through which you can raise any concerns you might have. If you remain dissatisfied with the outcome of the internal review, you can apply to the Information Commissioner's Office (ICO), who will consider whether the organisation has complied with its obligations under the Act and can require the organisation to remedy any problems. Generally, the ICO cannot make a decision unless you have exhausted the complaints procedure provided by NHS Nottingham and Nottinghamshire ICB.
