



# Accessing COVID-19 treatments for eligible care home residents

The guidance for who is eligible for treatment AND the process to access tests changes from June 2024. The guidance now includes all people aged over 70 in care homes as well as other groups who may be in your care home.

#### What you need to do:

#### **1. Understand who is eligible**

Full guidance on eligibility can be found on the ICB website by scanning the QR code or visiting **notts.icb.nhs.uk/covid-19treatments-for-care-home-residents.** You can also seek help from primary care and community care home teams if needed.





#### 2. Get prepared with tests - locate your pharmacy

See which pharmacies are offering free lateral flow tests by visiting the ICB website or scan the QR code. We recommend ordering the tests in advance and keeping them ready for when residents present with symptoms.

## **3. Complete the LFD form for eligible residents and take to your pharmacy to collect the tests.**

A digital copy of the form can be found by visiting the ICB website or scanning the QR code.

### 4. If a resident is eligible and symptomatic, complete a test

The test should be completes as quickly as possible. If there are 2 or more residents with respiratory symptoms irrespective of the LFD result, contact your community IPC team for further advice and guidance

### 5. If the test is positive, refer to COVID Medicine Delivery Unit

If the test is negative but they continue to have symptoms, they should take another test on each of the next two days (three tests in total over three days).
