There is no single person with responsibility for migraine and headache services however, this is a commissioning function and as such would be undertaken by the Commissioning Team under the leadership of the Director of Integration.

No. The budget for neurology, forms part of the block payments to our acute Trusts. The ICB commissions:

- Neurology outpatients at Adult Neurosciences or Neurology Centres that have not been referred by a consultant.
- Neurology inpatients and neurology outpatients where these are provided at local hospitals that are not Adult Neurosciences or Neurology Centres.
- Services for patients who have had a stroke except where those patients need specialist interventions such as thrombectomy.

- All neurosurgery activity, including specialist interventions (such as thrombectomy) for patients who have had a stroke
- All interventional procedures within neuroradiology

- Associated services (neuropsychology, neuropsychiatry, neuro-rehabilitation,
- neuro critical care)
- Neurology outpatients, where the outpatient has been referred by a consultant
- Specialist services for patients with Creutzfeldt-Jakob disease

Redesign of pathways is overseen by the Medical Director, but it is the responsibility of the ICB and System Partners to work together.
