RE: Freedom of Information Request

With reference to your request for information I can confirm in accordance with Section 1 (1) of the Freedom of Information Act 2000 that we do not hold the information that you have requested. A response to your request is below.

- 2. How many of the patients in your Trust/ICS in a CAMHS tier 4 inpatient setting are out-of-area in the following <u>financial years</u> (2017, 2018, 2019, 2020, 2021, 2022, 2023) by provider i.e. NHS delivered or independent providers (such as the Priory Group, Elysium Healthcare etc.)?
- 3. The number of <u>new patients</u> in your Trust/ICS admitted a year to a CAMHS tier 4 inpatient setting in the following <u>financial years</u> (2017, 2018, 2019, 2020, 2021, 2022, 2023) by provider i.e. NHS delivered or independent providers (such as the Priory Group, Elysium Healthcare etc.)
- 4. The total cost per year of providing a CAMHS tier 4 inpatient service in the following <u>financial years</u> (2017, 2018, 2019, 2020, 2021, 2022, 2023) by provider i.e. NHS delivered or independent providers (such as the Priory Group, Elysium Healthcare etc.)

Nottingham and Nottinghamshire ICB do not hold the information requested relating to CAMHS Tier 4 provision and patients as we are not the responsible commissioners. Generally, the ICO cannot make a decision unless you have exhausted the complaints procedure provided by NHS Nottingham and Nottinghamshire ICB.
