RE: Freedom of Information Request

With reference to your request for information I can confirm in accordance with Section 1 (1) of the Freedom of Information Act 2000 that we do hold the information that you have requested. A response to your request is below.

In the request you asked:

For the time period of 2018/19 to 2023/24

1. Could you please tell me if your integrated care system has received funding from NHS England to develop and begin delivering new models of integrated primary and community care for adults and older adults with severe mental illnesses (SMI)

Yes.

2. Could you please tell me when it received the funding, or when it is set to receive it?

The ICS has received funding for this development each year from 2019/20 to 2023/24.

3. Could you also please specify how much total funding the ICS has received for this purpose?

Funding allocations for Mental Health Transformation are not provided by programme area. However, the NHS England Long Term Plan ambitions tool provides an indicative value that should be invested. The indicative funding for Community Mental Health investment is shown in the table below.

4. Could you also please provide a list of these models, specifying when they were established/are due to be established, the amount of funding allocated for each, and WTE staff approved for each?

- In line with NHSE guidance, in 2019/20 and 2020/21 the emphasis was on stabilising and bolstering community teams in preparation for transformation.
- The transformation has been in phases, with new models of integrated primary and community care commencing in Mid Notts and Bassetlaw in 2021/22, South Notts in 2022/23 and Nottingham City in 2023/24.
- Individual Placement and Support (IPS)/Employment support is in place across the ICS and has increased each year since 2019/20.

- A model for improving the physical health of people with Severe Mental Illness has been in place since 2021/22.
- The Personality Disorder pathway has been developed over the past 3 years.
- The adult eating disorder pathway has been transformed across the ICS over the past 2 years in line with national guidance.
- The Early Intervention in Psychosis (EIP) Services are in place across all areas and meeting national standards.
- In 2023/24 the Community Rehabilitation Pathway model is being developed.

If you are unhappy with the way in which your request has been handled, NHS Nottingham and Nottinghamshire Integrated Care Board (ICB) have an internal review procedure through which you can raise any concerns you might have. If you remain dissatisfied with the outcome of the internal review, you can apply to the Information Commissioner's Office (ICO), who will consider whether the organisation has complied with its obligations under the Act and can require the organisation to remedy any problems. Generally, the ICO cannot make a decision unless you have exhausted the complaints procedure provided by NHS Nottingham and Nottinghamshire ICB.
