**RE: Freedom of Information Request**

With reference to your request for information I can confirm in accordance with Section 1 (1) of the Freedom of Information Act 2000 that we do hold the information that you have requested. A response to each part of your request is attached.

In the request you asked:

Under *the Freedom of Information Act*, I would like you to please answer the following questions that relate to commissioning and procurements that have been run in Nottingham and Nottinghamshire ICB under both the Public Contracts Regulations and the Procurement, Patient Choice and Competition Regulations (PPCCR) regime since 1st July 2022.

For context, we are trying to find out if Nottingham and Nottinghamshire ICB is running procurements under both the Public Contracts Regulations and the Procurement, Patient Choice and Competition Regulations (PPCCR) regime (herein referred to as the current procurement rules), and we want to clarify how many procurements were run under these procurement regimes. To be clear, the procurements we are referring to are for clinical healthcare services only.

- a. What is the total number of procurements (*clinical healthcare services only*) that Nottingham and Nottinghamshire ICB have conducted since 1<sup>st</sup> July 2022?
- b. Has Nottingham and Nottinghamshire ICB made any procurements (*clinical healthcare services only*) of a new service under the current procurement rules since 1<sup>st</sup> July 2022? (*by new service meaning not previously being delivered by a provider*).
- c. If yes to *b*, how many procurements (*clinical healthcare services only*) of a new service has Nottingham and Nottinghamshire ICB made under the current procurement rules since 1<sup>st</sup> July 2022? (*by new service meaning not previously being delivered by a provider*).
- d. If yes to *c*, what type of organisation won each procurement (*clinical healthcare services only*) – Please also provide the names of each successful organisation; and whether they are private, social enterprise, charity or public; and what the contract was for.
- e. If no to *c* (*so an existing service*), what was each type of incumbent provider? - Please also provide the names of each incumbent successful organisation; and whether they are private, social enterprise, charity or public; and what the contract was for.
- f. Of each of those listed in *e*, did the incumbent provider win the procurement (*clinical healthcare services only*)? – Please also provide the names of each successful organisation; and whether they are private, social enterprise, charity or public; and what the contract was for.

- g. If no to f, what was the provider type for each of the successful new providers? Please also provide the names of each successful organisation; and whether they are private, social enterprise, charity or public; and what the contract was for.

As requested, please see attached [Excel document](#) in response to the above questions.

If you are unhappy with the way in which your request has been handled, NHS Nottingham and Nottinghamshire Integrated Care Board (ICB) have an internal review procedure through which you can raise any concerns you might have. If you remain dissatisfied with the outcome of the internal review, you can apply to the Information Commissioner's Office (ICO), who will consider whether the organisation has complied with its obligations under the Act and can require the organisation to remedy any problems. Generally, the ICO cannot make a decision unless you have exhausted the complaints procedure provided by NHS Nottingham and Nottinghamshire ICB.
