\*Dementia rates are *only* payable to care homes who have achieved the Nottinghamshire County Council Quality Dementia Mark. <u>Care Homes outside of Nottinghamshire</u> the prices for NHS continuing healthcare in care homes outside of Nottinghamshire will be paid at the contract rate set by the Integrated Care Board where the care home is located.

<u>One to One Hourly rate</u> – A rate of £15.54 per hour will apply to 1-1 care that has been approved in accordance with the Nottingham & Nottinghamshire ICB One to One Observations Policy for Fully Funded NHS CHC Residents in Care Homes <u>Funded Nursing Care</u> Where a resident is not eligible for NHS CHC but is eligible for a funded nursing care (FNC) contribution, care home providers should set an overall fee level for the provision of care and accommodation. This should include any registered nursing care provided. Where the ICB has assessed a resident's needs require the input of a registered nurse, the ICB will pay the NHS FNC payment (at the current nationally agreed rate) direct to the care home. The balance of the fee will then be paid by the individual, their representative or the Local Authority
