In addition, benchmarking is undertaken at a national level under the NHS Oversight Framework which enables various metrics to be measured against other ICBs or provider organisations, to enable relative ranking of performance to be determined, and hence benchmark delivery of services for patients against the rest of the country, assigning an upper, lower or inter quartile performance.
