RE: Freedom of Information Request

With reference to your request for information I can confirm in accordance with Section 1 (1) of the Freedom of Information Act 2000 that we partially hold the information that you have requested. A response to your request is below.

In the request you stated '*I would like to request information related to MRI machines, on which prostate cancer MRIs take place, in community diagnostic centres that are in operation in your area*'. You then asked:

I am requesting under the Freedom of Information Act a list of all the community diagnostic centres and their addresses in your area (both operational and any being developed), as well as the number of MRI machines at each diagnostic centre, and the age/date installed, make, manufacturer and specification of the MRI machines (e.g. installed in Dec 2022, GE Signa Architect, 3.0T) and if any AI software is installed and in use on them.

We do hold information in relation to Mansfield Community Diagnostic Centre; the address is Mansfield Community Hospital, Stockwell Gate, Mansfield, NG18 5QJ. There is one MRI machine (that will be installed during March 2025) and is a Philips Ingenia Ambition X.

We do not hold information in relation to the address for Nottingham City Community Diagnostic Centre as the location has yet to be finalised. The proposal is that there will be one MRI machine which is a Philips Ingenia Ambition X.

If you are unhappy with the way in which your request has been handled, NHS Nottingham and Nottinghamshire Integrated Care Board (ICB) have an internal review procedure through which you can raise any concerns you might have. If you remain dissatisfied with the outcome of the internal review, you can apply to the Information Commissioner's Office (ICO), who will consider whether the organisation has complied with its obligations under the Act and can require the organisation to remedy any problems. Generally, the ICO cannot make a decision unless you have exhausted the complaints procedure provided by NHS Nottingham and Nottinghamshire ICB.
