**Re: Freedom of Information Request** 

Thank you for your request for information, received on 13 January 2025, regarding elderly care. We have processed your request in accordance with the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA).

Under the FOIA, public authorities like ours are required to respond to requests for information within 20 working days. In response to your request, I can confirm that we partially hold the information requested.

For question 2a, please provide total spend on personal social services for people aged 65+. This will include spend on residential, nursing, and domiciliary care (2b, 2c, and 2d) as well as other social care for older people such as day services, etc

- 4. Please provide the Highest, average (mean) and lowest weekly fees paid for care home placements for older people (aged 65+) under a CHC package in financial year **2023/24** and **2024/25**:
  - a. Older person's residential
  - b. Older person's residential dementia
  - c. Older person's nursing
  - d. Older person's nursing dementia.
- 5. Please provide the proposed average percentage uplift to the weekly rate paid by the ICB between **2023/24** and **2024/25**:
  - a. Older person's residential
  - b. Older person's residential dementia
  - c. Older person's nursing
  - d. Older person's nursing dementia.
