**Re: Freedom of Information Request**

Thank you for your request for information, received on 15 December 2025, regarding follow-up to FOI 25-1286 (late paid suppliers). We have processed your request in accordance with the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA).

Under the FOIA, public authorities like ours are required to respond to requests for information within 20 working days. In response to your request, I can confirm that we partially hold the information requested.

**Details of your request:**

*Thank you again for the information you provided in fulfilment of FOI reference NN-ICB/25-1286 supplied on 17/09/2025.*

*I have now received responses and data from over 600 public bodies. Many have, without prompting, included additional fields beyond those originally requested, which add helpful context to late payment data.*

I'm writing to ask whether any of the following fields (or similar) are already available within your system, and if so, whether you could add them to the dataset you previously provided under FOI reference NN-ICB/25-1286 supplied on 17/09/2025.

Providing the date you received the invoice would be a really useful addition as would any of the other examples below:

- Invoice due date
- Invoice approved date
- Invoice payment terms
- Invoice query/dispute flag (e.g. Y/N)
- Reason for invoice query/dispute/delay

*I want to emphasise that I do not wish to create any additional work. I'm only asking for this information if it already exists in your system and can be exported easily alongside the information you've already supplied.*

*If these fields are available and can be shared, I'd be very grateful if you could provide them (even if this means treating it as a new request). If not, please just let me know and I'll make a note — there's no need to take any further action.*

## Our response to your request:

The remaining information requested is not held in a reportable format within our system and cannot be extracted from existing reports. As such, this information is not held for the purposes of the FOIA.

Generally, the ICO cannot make a decision unless you have exhausted the complaints procedure provided by NHS Nottingham and Nottinghamshire ICB.
