Re: Freedom of Information Request

Thank you for your request for information, received on 19 December 2025, regarding total and budgeted spend in areas of care. We have processed your request in accordance with the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA).

Hospice care for adults and children is commissioned through a block contract. As a result, the budgeted and actual expenditure are the same for each financial year
