Re: Freedom of Information Request

Thank you for your request for information, received on 22 December 2025, regarding mental healthcare at Highbury Hospital. We have processed your request in accordance with the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA).

Under the FOIA, public authorities like ours are required to respond to requests for information within 20 working days. In response to your request, I can confirm that we do not hold the information requested.

Details of your request:

1. What are the salary bands for NHS mental health practitioners in Nottingham, Highbury Hospital.
2. What percentage of patients of Outpatient and Inpatient mental healthcare at Nottingham Highbury rate their experience as helpful or positive, neutral or negative, since 2015 and since 2022.
3. What percentage of NHS patients at Highbury Outpatient and Inpatient have expressed that they found mental health services abusive, since 2015 and since 2022.
4. What percentage of male Outpatients and female Outpatients have a social worker, since 2015, since 2022 and in 2025.
5. What percentage of ethnicities (e.g. White, Asian, Chinese, Black, Mixed Race) are successful or unsuccessful for an Autism diagnosis and for an ADHD since 2015 and since 2022.
6. What the current NHS Nottinghamshire policy is on proactively asking patients about potential ACEs, abuse or traumatic experiences (rather than neglecting to ask about these things) and whether this policy was decided on with input from those with Lived Experience of abuse and to see the clinical study or report on that Lived Experience research.
7. If ACEs, abuse or traumatic experiences mentioned in #6 are not as policy proactively asked about, is this because the NHS believes it is irrelevant to mental healthcare or too uncomfortable to ask about, as Social Work England claim?
8. What percentage of NHS LMHT Outpatients at Highbury and patients at Nottinghamshire IAPT become homeless either while under the services or within 6 months of being under services.
9. What percentage of NHS staff have specialised training in any of childhood abuse, ACEs or childhood trauma.

Our response to your request:

If you remain dissatisfied with the outcome of the internal review, you can apply to the Information Commissioner's Office (ICO), who will consider whether the organisation has complied with its obligations under the Act and can require the organisation to remedy any problems. Generally, the ICO cannot make a decision unless you have exhausted the complaints procedure provided by NHS Nottingham and Nottinghamshire ICB.
