**Re: Freedom of Information Request**

Thank you for your request for information, received on 27 January 2026, regarding asylum seeker healthcare. We have processed your request in accordance with the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA).

Under the FOIA, public authorities like ours are required to respond to requests for information within 20 working days. In response to your request, I can confirm that we do hold the information requested.

**Please find below our response to your request:**

Please provide the following information for each of the financial years 2021/22, 2022/23, and 2023/24 (or the most recent years held):

1. The total expenditure by the Integrated Care Board on healthcare services commissioned specifically for asylum seekers and/or people in the asylum system.

Nottingham and Nottinghamshire ICB commission the Asylum Seeker Health Check Local Enhanced Service (LES) specifically for asylum seekers and/or people in the asylum system. This is a primary care service and the total expenditure by financial year is shown in the table below:

2. Where available, a breakdown of this expenditure by service type (for example: primary care, mental health, community health services, secondary care).

The 'primary care' Asylum Seeker Health Check Local Enhanced Service is the only healthcare service that the ICB specifically commissions for the asylum seekers and/or people in the asylum system.

3. The names of any NHS Trusts, GP practices, or third-party providers with whom the ICB held contracts or service level agreements relating specifically to the provision of healthcare services for asylum seekers during this period, together with the total annual value of each contract.

Nottingham and Nottinghamshire ICB commission the Asylum Seeker Health Check Local Enhanced Service directly with GP Practices. There are no values included in the contracts, and payments are made based on activity for the period.

Please find attached a list of the 105 GP Practices that had a contract with Nottingham and Nottinghamshire ICB for the Asylum Seeker Health Check Local Enhanced Service in 2024/2025.

If you are unhappy with the way in which your request has been handled, NHS Nottingham and Nottinghamshire Integrated Care Board (ICB) has an internal review procedure through which you can raise any concerns you might have. If you remain dissatisfied with the outcome of the internal review, you can apply to the Information Commissioner's Office (ICO), who will consider whether the organisation has complied with its obligations under the Act and can require the organisation to remedy any problems. Generally, the ICO cannot make a decision unless you have exhausted the complaints procedure provided by NHS Nottingham and Nottinghamshire ICB.
